


Attenborough


We have started learning about the Ancient Egypt era that we are enjoying so much already. We explored Tutankhamun's tomb in our first lesson.

This week in Thompson the pupils were starting our new computing topic which is coding. Students were using a software called 'Code Gibbon' to write their own lines of code to make a computer programmes.






Mandela


We have already raised some money through our own PSA fundraising efforts and kickstarted the campaign by donating £5000 of existing PSA funds to the page.
