Reception had a big surprise this week when they came in to find a mess and their registration handprints missing! After finding some hidden clues and having a great discussion, the class decided it was Grandma Swagg from our topic book Cops and Robbers! Mozart

This week in Mozart Class we have been learning about the human body in Science. As a class, the children drew around a child and the children then wrote down different body parts and stuck their labels around the outlined child.



Over the last two weeks in Art class with Miss Hen, Hadid class have been learning about basic colour theory by studying the colour wheel and colour mixing. It includes an exploration of primary and secondary colours and how artists use colour in their artwork. Such as Piet Mondrian and Keith Haring.

Take a look at their work to see how these skills were used to produce mosaic art.





Rashford

This week Seacole Class have been learning about the civil rights activist Rosa Parks. We have linked our learning about 'Being

Me in My world' in PSHE, significant individuals in History in 'Great Change -Makers of the World' and Black History Month. We have dis-



cussed the importance of recognising and celebrating the history of black people from African and Caribbean communities, respecting each other and developing resilience and determination when facing challenging situations. We have worked collaboratively to create spider diagrams to show how Rosa Parks might have felt about the unfairness affecting black people and her bravery which led to changes in the segregation laws of her time.

In Rashford class, we celebrated our cultures by dressing up in something from our heritage. The children loved discussing where they are from and how they celebrate their ancestry. It was lovely to hear the children speaking so proudly and respecting one another's differences

As a highlight of our learning about Ancient Egypt the children in Attenborough class designed pyramids and mummified oranges. They have shown incredible creativity in both projects.

As we all know, Mr. Bloom is passionate about his science; yet again Year 6 is posting a science -related article. This week, we visited <u>The Science Museum</u>. Science is all about inquiry and wonder - so it only seemed fitting that we spend an hour in the The Wonder Lab, where we had hands-on experiences with a variety of objects and devices, and some enjoyed a live chemistry demonstration, where things went Zap! Pop! And Ping! To end our visit, we split off into our mini-groups to explore parts of the museum that sparked our curiosity.

In terms of Writing, we will soon be ending our unit with a Narrative inspired by JK Rowling's 'The Tales of Beedle the Bard'. The children have work tirelessly to incor-

porate figurative language and features for suspense into their works. We cannot wait to read these, and hopefully share some shining examples in the next Newsletter.

Wandering through the graveyard it felt like something was watching me.


The eyes in the painting follow him down the corridor.

They trained in evidence-based approaches for a range of wellbeing concerns including anxiety, low mood and behavioural difficulties.

- The importance of play.
- Learning through praise and rewards.
- Supporting your child to understand and regulate feelings.
- Empathetic boundary setting.
- Space for questions and troubleshooting.
- Parent peer support sharing and understanding.



Year 2: Little Angel Theatre trip to support the English curriculum


Year 3: A trip to the West End to see The Lion King and a visit to the London Aquarium

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FOCUS ON SPORT






