Attenborough class delved into the rich history of ancient civilizations during their visit to the British Museum last week. The children

immersed themselves in the study of artefacts from both Ancient Egypt and Mesopotamia, exploring the intricate details of ancient cultures. It was a fascinating journey through time as they examined artefacts like clay tablets and pottery, gaining a deeper understanding of the daily lives and customs of these civilizations. The trip provided valuable insights into the cultural and technological advancements that shaped human history.

While the kids were deciphering hieroglyphics like pros they were wondering if Mesopotamians also had their own version of ancient emoji's. #TimeTravelersInTraining Last week Benjamin class visited the British Museum. It was a perfect end to the term in which they had studied ancient Egypt and Mesopotamia. No longer were the Rosetta Stone, mummies and 3000 year old musical instruments just something they read about or saw pictures of; finally they had the artefacts in front of them. Some of the children, as you can see, imagined what it would be like to be an exhibit themselves posing in the position of the ancient Egyptian god Osiris.



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Year 4 went on a trip this week to the National Gallery. We were taken on a tour of the gallery where the children learned about the materials, techniques and processes used when painting. We studied a couple of amazing paintings and tried to work out what the painter was conveying through their work. We even got to see the Sunflower Painting by Vincent van Gogh.
