


On Wednesday 28th February, author Jennifer Killick will be here to hold assemblies and workshops about super-powers and animal agents!

She will happily sign copies of Alex Sparrow and the Really Big Stink. The book is £6.99 and can be ordered in advance through Mrs Efthymiou.


On World Book Day itself, we would love everyone to come to school dressed as a character from a book. This dress up day is always great fun and we will have a parade and prizes for great costumes!
