

Air Pollution

What we can do to improve local air quality for our family's health

Walk, cycle, scoot – don't pollute Ditch the car for short trips to school and the shops. Use public transport or your bike for longer trips.

If you have a car, consider buying a cleaner one

Use an app or the GLA's Newer Vehicle Checker/TfL's Vehicle Checker to find the least polluting electric or hybrid option. Or try car sharing.

Don't idle

Turn off your engine at railway crossings, traffic lights and in heavy traffic. Keeping it switched off until you're ready to drive will use less fuel, save you money and reduce pollution.

Keep away from the kerb

...when walking along busy roads or waiting at bus stops. Take quieter roads whenever possible.

Stop using wood-burning stoves and open fires

...because they produce significant amounts of harmful particulate matter.

Rethink home deliveries

Group your deliveries or collect them from a locker. Choose delivery companies that use cleaner vehicles. Better still, shop locally on foot and by bike.
