### School Times and Lateness

The vast majority of our children arrive in plenty of time for the start of our school day. They are also well prepared and have everything that they need with them for the day ahead. We still have a small number of pupil's who arrive at school late and the effect that this has on them and their classmates is really disruptive. Firstly, they are often upset and embarrassed at having to walk into class when everyone else is already settling down to work. Secondly, they have missed the important daily instructions that their teacher has already given to the rest of the class. Thirdly, it is unsettling for the other children when their focus is interrupted. Minutes lost from learning time really add up and can result in whole days being missed over the school year – for example 15 minutes per day equates to 10 whole days lost over the year!
