PARENT GOVERNOR VACANCIES

We are looking for new parent governors to join the governing body. One of our parents has resigned meaning that we have one vacancy. Another of our current parent governor's four year term has come to an end and although she wants to continue the role is open to new applicants as well. Every parent/carer of a pupil is entitled to serve as a parent governor.

What does the governing body do?

Working in partnership with the head and other staff, governors are responsible for:

- Ensuring clarity of vision, ethos and strategic direction of the school;
- Holding the head Teacher to account for the educational performance of the school and its pupils, and the performance management of staff; and
- Overseeing the financial performance of the school and making sure its money is well spent.

What are we looking for in a parent governor?

Parent governors do not need to have any background in education. Rather, we are looking for people who have:

- An active interest in the education of our pupils.
- A commitment to quality and raising standards within our school.
- An willingness to work with others and to contribute as a member of a team.
- A willingness to promote the school within the community it serves.
- The ability to support and challenge the Head Teacher and her leadership team.
- The time to prepare for and attend Governors' meetings.

What is the time commitment?

There are approximately six full governors meetings a year with meetings usually running from about 6:30pm on a Thursday. Governors are also asked to join one of the committees that meet around six times a year and/or to take on a "link" role with special responsibility for a particular area of focus, e.g. reading. You will need to spend time getting to know the school well and preparing for meetings by reading paperwork beforehand. Governors are expected to attend induction training and other training depending on their needs. Once elected, your term of office will be four years.

What's in it for me?

It is not a role to be taken on lightly but a committed governor will find it very rewarding, with opportunities for personal and professional development and a chance to influence the direction of the school. As well as the available training you will be supported by other governors and the clerk to the governing body.

What are the next steps if I am interested?

If you wish to put yourself forward please pick up an application form from the school office and return it by **Friday 7th June**.

If there are more than two candidates then there will be a ballot of parents. In this case candidates will be asked to write a short description of themselves to circulate with the ballot paper.
