


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This week we have been planning and writing our own stories based upon a familiar folk tale. We have enjoyed creating our own characters and settings to include in our stories




This week, after lots of hard work rehearsing, Bolt Class took part in the KS1 Nativity. We loved performing and you can watch the whole show on Google Classroom.


