



Dahl

Attenborough



Gandhi




The children have been doing amazing work on urban landscapes and perspective in their art books. The only down side is these I can't hang these up and wallow in their incredible artistic streaks!

We had fun making surrealist collages this week!




Malala

After working really hard on our mock SATs this week we enjoyed some well earned time in the sun. The children have been working so hard all year!




Zone


