This week in Literacy, children focussed on Greek Myths. They summarise the story- Odysseus and the Cyclops through freeze frames. They had plenty of fun.







The class became Greek architects this week. After learning about the three classical styles of architectural columns and how to recognise one from the other, the children then drew The Parthenon in their books. It was a pain staking exercise as they all took their time, but they did brilliant-

ly, highlighting the sculptures, frieze and pediment (yes you can ask them if you are stuck).
