The children made carrot juice this week.

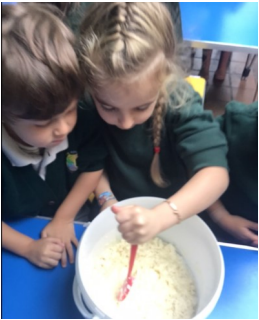
We cut our own carrots using a knife and then we put our chopped carrots in the blender.

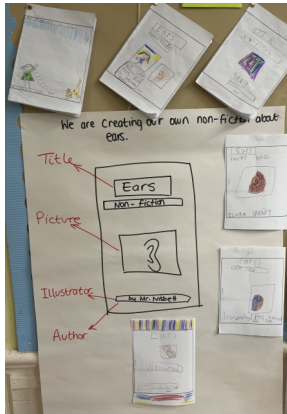
Donaldson

Mozart class has had a creative week making non-fiction books about our ears. We first learnt key facts about our ears and gradually added information to our books.



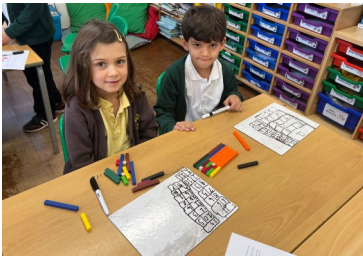
Hadid

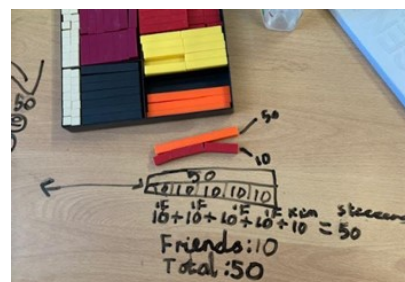
Benjamin

We have started a new book this term called Floodland by Marcus Sedgwick. It is set in a futuristic England where the sea levels have risen and claimed a lot of the land. A young girl is separated from her parents and must travel across the sea visiting islands in search of them. To engage and excite the children about this book, we set up a game in the hall using various pieces of equipment to represent 'islands' and played a modified version of 'the floor is lava' where the hall floor was the rising sea levels. The last children each round to get onto a piece of equipment were 'claimed by the sea' and were out. Year 5 had a lot of fun playing this and we ended up with 4 skillful winners!

To start our History unit on the Anglo-Saxons, Year 6 visited Bury St. Edmunds, where we explored one of England's great archaeological sites. West Stow is the site of an early Anglo-Saxon village, occupied from 420-650CE, over 400 years before the Norman Conquest. In 1976, the *West Stow Anglo-Saxon Village Trust* was formally established to manage the site, at that stage there were only three reconstructed houses within the village. The first built replica house is now being used as an experiment - at over 50 years old - historians are watching how this building degrades over time

On Thursday 7th and Friday 8th, some Chestnuts Y5 and Y6 pupils took part in a Tag Rugby Tournament and Festival at New River Sport and Fitness. Tag Rugby is a great game based on the main principles of Rugby League football: passing and evasion.
