Islamophobia Workshop - May 2024

Diversity and Inclusion is at the forefront of Year 6's approach. Throughout the year, we have looked at discrimination in many of its guises, and we continue to fight hate through education and discussion.

We were part of a workshop lead by a Bolton-based Imam called Imran, where we looked at Islamophobia in the UK, the results of Hate Crimes, and some of the causes of discrimination against Muslims. After the workshop, as a whole year group, we discussed some of the issues raised. We looked at how the media can affect people's perceptions, and how education is essential in breaking down anti-Islamic stereotypes.

Children shared their thoughts, feelings and experiences of racism and discrimination in a safe space. We are proud of the kind, empathic, and inclusive attitudes our children have here at Chestnuts











Looking at the cave paintings at Lascaux in France the children in year 2 used earthy pigmented oil pastels and chalks to recreate their own prehistoric art on a canvas of recycled cardboard. They are brilliant!
