They then coloured it in using bright pencils. We spoke about colour shading. The final stage will be adding black felt tip outlines to make the colours pop. They really liked seeing lots of his bright colourful pictures. Our favourite one was 'The Bigger Splash' because it reminded us of swimming and the summer holidays!









We are learning about mini-beasts in Reception. Last week, some caterpillars arrived and we have been really enjoying seeing them grow. They grow so fast! We have been learning about the life cycle of the butterfly and as they change we are recording this in our caterpillar diaries.









In Mozart Class we thoroughly enjoyed power off day last term. As a class we went over to chestnuts park and used leaves to make rubbings of leaves using green and brown colouring pencils. We then cut out our rubbings and placed them on a large piece of paper to create what we called our 'Mozart Eco Tree'.

In Geography we have been learning about "Living by the Sea" and were very lucky that Ms Hen (in art) taught the children about multimedia art. The children used wax crayons to learn about wax resistance. They then used paint in a spray bottle. Once they had completed the background the children designed their own pike, stickleback and trout fish to go on top as their final layer. Thank you Ms Hen, they are amazing!


