Nursery

The children created their own safari animal by making a lions mane out of paper plates and coloured paper. Using the paper plates as the lion's mane, they cut and glued pieces of yellow and orange paper to form the lion's hair.









We had a special caterpillar delivery during the first week of this half term! We observed the lifecycle of the butterfly and enjoyed watching the caterpillars grow and change. We wrote about each stage in our caterpillar diaries. This week we released the butterflies into the garden.





We have looked at the book 'Rosie Revere Engineer' and have spent the last 2 weeks being engineers ourselves and thinking about flying machines. We have explored different ways of flying, made parachutes and even designed and made our own machines from recycling. Each time, after flying them, we have reflected on what may help them to fly even more effectively. It has been a lot of fun!

This week in Mozart Class we have been learning new spelling patterns. We looked at the split digraphs o-e and u-e and enjoyed adding these digraphs to different letters to make words and then practice these words in our handwriting books.

We enjoyed this so much and we can now identify digraphs in words that will help us with our spelling in our written work.


